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Inspection Results

Z 0000 INITIAL COMMENTS

At the time of the survey, Treatment Center of Brunswick was not in compliance with Chapter 290-9-12, Rules and Regulations for Narcotic Treatment Programs, as a result of investigation #GA00118091. The following deficiency was cited:

Z 0702 290-9-12-.07(3) APPLICATIONS

False or Misleading Information. An application for a license must be truthfully and fully completed. In the event that the Department has reason to believe that an application has not been completed truthfully, the Department may require additional verification of the facts alleged. The Department may revoke a license or refuse to issue a license where material false statements have been made on or in connection with an application.

This Requirement is not met as evidenced by:

Based on a review of facility records, employee records, the Department of Community Health (DCH), application for license to operate a Narcotic Treatment Program, and State of Georgia Composite Medical Board records, it was determined that the facility submitted a licensure application to the Department with false and misleading information.

Findings:

A review of the facility's organizational chart revealed the following information: employee #1 was listed as the President / CEO / Program Sponsor of the facility and employee #4, was listed as the medical director. The program policy and procedure, Structure and Staffing, p.19, identified employee #1, as the Program Sponsor MD0 , and Designated Authority.

A review of employee #1's, personnel record, revealed two letters of recommendation from community business owners addressing employee #1 as an MD (Medical Doctor). A review of the State of Georgia Composite Medical Board, license verification system, revealed that there was no documentation found that confirmed employee #1, was licensed to practice medicine in the State of Georgia.

A review of the DCH application for license to operate a Narcotic Treatment Program 2011, revealed that employee #1, represented himself as a State of Georgia licensed medical doctor

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(M.D.), on the licensure application for a Narcotic Treatment Program, submitted to the department dated, October 21, 2011, with his/her notarized signature.

A review of the State of Georgia Composite Medical Board license verification system revealed, that employee #1, has not ever been issued a licensed to practice medicine.

A review of facility records revealed, no documentation that employee #1, provided medical care to clients at the facility.
